New Facility Additions Now Open

We are pleased to announce the Career Technical Education (CTE) addition at Riverside High School and the eight-classroom addition at Riverview Elementary and have been open to staff and students since January of 2026.

The CTE addition at the high school was made possible thanks to a \$2.5 million grant from the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce. The addition allows for Riverside Campus to have significantly more space for career education and hands-on learning. The space is being used to expand and enhance the Construction,

Advanced Manufacturing and Healthcare programs that were already offered at the high school. Unfortunately, due to a lack of space, previous offerings of those programs were limited and this additional space will allow for increased enrollment into these programs. Riverside is extremely proud to offer several meaningful career electives where students are able to earn credentials in a specific industry, as well as gain valuable experience in a career field of their choice.

The addition at Riverview Elementary helps solve current enrollment issues as well as creating

additional space for students who will eventually reside in the Riverview Elementary district due to several large-scale housing projects slated to begin construction soon. In addition to the eight classrooms, a new parking lot with an additional 48 parking spaces was also constructed. The Riverview construction project was funded out of the District's Permanent Improvement Fund.

The Board is still working on plans for an addition at Buckeye Elementary as well. Those details will be communicated once finalized.

At the January 2, 2026 Board of Education Organizational Meeting, new Board members Joseph Audino and Jimmielee Vires — and re-elected board member, Belinda Grassi, were sworn in.

Joe and Jimmielee were elected, and Belinda was re-elected for her fifth term, to the Board of Education on November 4, 2025.

■ **Joseph Audino** is a Marketplace Director for Best Buy, with responsibilities impacting 22 stores across Northeast Ohio and West Virginia. These locations include more than 1,000 employees and generate over \$800 million in annual revenue. His role spans financial performance, operations, human resources, facility management, and community engagement. Joe has been with Best Buy since 2009, serving as a General Manager for over a decade before stepping into his current position in 2023.

He earned his bachelor's degree from Youngstown State University; Beeghly College of Liberal Arts, Social Sciences and Education, with an emphasis in education and a minor in music. His early career included six years

as Assistant Director of Bands at Shenango High School and four years directing theater at Mercer High School, experiences that continue to influence his structured and creative leadership style.

A longtime Lake County resident, Joe is actively involved in his parish community. He currently serves on Parish Council at St. Gabriel's Parish in Concord and co-chairs the parish's annual St. Gabriel's Summer Festival, coordinating over 1,200 volunteers and dozens of community partners.

Joe and his wife Lauren, a teacher in the Willoughby-Eastlake School District since 2005, have three daughters who attend Riverside schools. As both a parent and board member, Joe is committed to transparency, collaboration, and practical leadership that reflects the values of the Riverside community.

■ **Jimmielee Vires** is a Tax Analyst for Lubrizol and prior to that, was a Tax Auditor for the Ohio Department of Taxation. He has been involved in the Riverside community for the past 10 years as his wife, Ali, is a Riverside teacher and former

coach. They have two daughters and the oldest will begin Kindergarten at Parkside Elementary in August of 2026.

Jimmielee is passionate about giving back to kids in the community, and was a coach himself for six years. This calling, as well as his career in tax and finance, were what inspired him to pursue a position on the board.

■ **Belinda Grassi** has served on the Riverside Board of Education since 2009. She is currently the Chief Financial Officer at HELP Foundation. Belinda holds an active Certified Public Accountant license from The Accountancy Board of Ohio as well as a valid School Treasurer's license from the Ohio Department of Education. She is a member of The Ohio Society of CPAs, the American Institute of CPAs, Ohio School Boards Association, Ohio Association of School Business Officials, and the Society for Human Resource Management.

Belinda lives in Concord Township with her husband Morris. Their two sons, Dante and Marco, both graduated from Riverside High School.

AP Excellence For School And Students



We are pleased to announce that Riverside High School has been recognized for the 2025 Advanced Placement (AP) School Honor Roll by the College Board. The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools whose AP programs are delivering results for students while broadening participation.

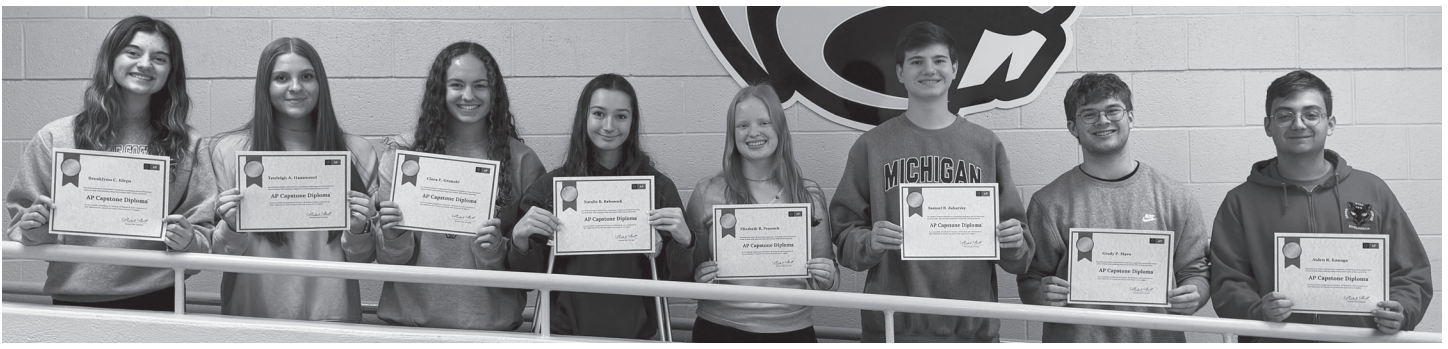
Schools can earn this recognition annually based on criteria that reflect a commitment to increasing college-going culture, providing opportunities for students to earn college credit, and maximizing college readiness.

Currently, Riverside High School offers 14 AP courses: AP Research, AP Seminar, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Environmental Science, Psychology, Physics, Statistics, U.S. History and U.S. Government.

This recognition by the College Board is the result of a school-wide effort — from administration, counselors, teachers, students and families — to make AP access a priority.

In addition, eight seniors were recognized as the first ever Riverside High School AP Capstone Diploma recipients. This is an internationally recognized award from the College Board given to students who complete a two-year program focused on research, collaboration and critical thinking. They must also earn scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research and on four additional AP Exams.

Students Inducted Into National Honor Society



Riverside High School is proud to announce its newest inductees into the Dr. Mary Allen Porter Chapter of the National Honor Society.

To be considered for membership,

students must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5. Additionally, potential members must meet high standards of leadership, service and character.

or more service projects in the school or community. Character is measured in terms of integrity, behavior, ethics, and cooperation with both students and faculty.

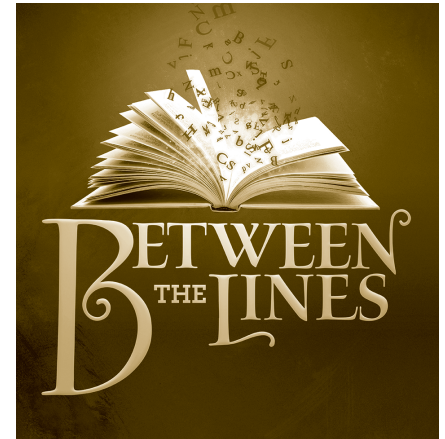
